

BÀI 5: TỪ TRÁI NGHĨA

Cũng giống như dạng bài tìm từ đồng nghĩa, dạng bài tìm từ trái nghĩa được thiết kế để kiểm tra vốn từ vựng của thí sinh. Nếu vốn từ vựng của bạn chưa đủ rộng thì cũng đừng lo quá nhé vì trong bài học này, các bạn sẽ được giới thiệu phương pháp đoán nghĩa của từ và các mẹo tránh bẫy trong bài thi.

Kiến Thức Cần Nhớ

Sau khi đã nghiên cứu rất nhiều đề thi qua các năm, có thể nhận thấy rằng, trong dạng đề tìm từ trái nghĩa, sẽ có ít nhất 1 đáp án là từ đồng nghĩa với từ được in đậm hoặc gạch chân nhằm đánh lừa học sinh.

Trong 2 ví dụ trên:

At a loose end = having nothing to do



Identical = similar = alike

Cách tránh bẫy:

Đọc kỹ đề bài, chú ý đề bài là *CLOSEST* hay *OPPOSITE*. Nếu là dạng bài *OPPOSITE* phải loại ngay đáp án là từ đồng nghĩa.

2. Phương pháp làm bài

Bước 1: Đọc kỹ câu hỏi

Bước 2: Dựa vào các từ vệ tinh, liên từ, keyword để đoán nghĩa của từ, hoặc xác định sắc thái tích cực hoặc tiêu cực của từ trong văn cảnh.

Bước 3: Loại trừ các đáp án cùng nghĩa hoặc không liên quan.

Bước 4: Chọn từ trái nghĩa

Áp dụng:

"The twin girls are so identical that I can't distinguish one from the other."

Loại trừ đáp án A và B vì là từ cùng nghĩa, đáp án D không liên quan

Bước 4: Chọn từ trái nghĩa -> đáp án C
